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do not constitute the totality of amendments which I think would be appropriate. But that will be done at a future date. On this particular amendment, because we're talking about how an organization becomes a recognized car club, and there is the requirement that it be a nonprofit organization, I think that the language on line 9 should be modified, and that's what my amendment would do. That language now says that this organization "must be a nonprofit organization with established bylaws. I would strike the word "established" and after "bylaws" insert "filed with the Secretary of State. And I will ask Senator...is it okay with you? Oh. Senator Cudaback says this is okay with him. And the reason I'm offering it and saying that the bylaws should be filed, to establish itself as a nonprofit organization it's going to have to make certain filings. So we don't want there to just be bylaws existing somewhere, but we want them to be filed with the Secretary of State. So that's the amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: You've heard the opening on the amendment. Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I understand what Senator Chambers is trying to do here, but I think we're creating some bureaucracy and redundancy maybe not needed. They have to file these bylaws with the Department of Motor Vehicles under the statutes. I don't know whether we want to clutter up the Secretary of State with filing them there, also. I think it's just redundancy. I've been easy to get along with up till now, Senator Chambers. Okay, that's it. I'll give you my time, Senator Chambers, if you'd like it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Chambers, you want some more time?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I'm not trying to delay Senator Baker's bill, but he is...I turned back there and gave the "I yield" sign, but he kept on and on. I'm going to withdraw (laugh) this pending amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Did I get you right? You're withdrawing your amendment?
