SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laugh) Well, if you don't want me to.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, no, fine. I didn't understand what you said. You're withdrawing?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I intend to withdraw it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, it is withdrawn.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Chambers, to open on FA499.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I hope Senator Baker and Senator Cudaback will listen to this amendment, not that they haven't listened to the others, but I'm going to explain why I'm doing it, not that I haven't explained why I was doing the others. But with that preliminary, I think I have everybody listening now who may be interested. On page 5, in line 17, the department, it says, may identify and maintain a list of qualified car club representatives. I would strike the word "may" and insert the word "shall," because as you move through this amendment, this list is referred to repeatedly, and in some cases, it is to be turned over to other officials. So either the list shall be maintained or it shall not. But if it is made discretionary, then every place else in the bill where the word "list" appears, you'd have to add the words, "if such a list is maintained by the department." From the way I read the bill, there is the intent that this list of qualified representatives be compiled and that it be maintained by the department. Senator Baker or Senator Cudaback may have a comment on that. I've just been given the high sign. It's all right to proceed with this amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The opening on FA499, anyone wishing to speak on that amendment? Seeing none, Senator Chambers to close. He waives closing. The question is the advancement of FA499. Those wishing to vote for it please vote aye; those opposed, nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
