CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of FA499.

SENATOR JANSSEN: FA499 advances. Senator Chambers, to open on FA500. (Legislative Journal page 778.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, this is a very simple amendment. On page 5, in line 25, there is current language which says "such other information as required by the department." After the word "as," I would insert the words "may be." Then it would read, such other information as may be required by the department. So if I get the high sign, which I've just gotten, that is my opening, and I ask that this amendment be adopted.

SENATOR JANSSEN: You've heard the opening on FA500. Seeing no one wishing to speak, the question is, shall FA500 advance? Those in favor please vote aye; those opposed, nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of FA500.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The amendment is adopted. Senator Chambers, to open on FA501. (Legislative Journal page 778.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I feel a bit of sadness and sorrow at this point. I think I have failed miserably and let down my reputation. This amendment is the 13th amendment. It should be unlucky, but for Senators Baker and Cudaback, it is lucky. I have gone through, in one way or another, 13 amendments in probably less than a half hour. Can you imagine such a failure by a person who can take one amendment and stay on it for days and days and days? What in the world is this world coming to? We just never know what minute is going to be next, or what may be waiting around the corner to assail, assault, or surprise us. I might even make a comment on Senator Landis, walking down the aisle minding his own business, eating peanuts or candy, but I won't do that. I just feel like I'm giving...I'm moving too rapidly. But a promise a promise, and unlike the city of Omaha, which
