Senator Cunningham, let me ask you this. I basically support the small claims court. I think it really works well for situations where you have citizens who want to come in and represent themselves on these fence-type disputes. It was never really designed in the first place to be an instrument by which more sophisticated collection companies could collect debts. And as you know, when they're in that business, even though you can't have a lawyer, they train somebody in that business to be like a lawyer in the sense of understanding each and every little thing about presenting your claim before a small claims court. Let me ask you this. Would you have any interest in a proposition that raised the dollar amount but cut down on those ten times a year that you're allowed to file in small claims court? Because let's face it, if we're talking about the average citizen out there,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...they don't go to court ten times in their whole lives, much less ten times in a year. So something that allows ten filings is for the purpose that Senator Chambers objects to. If we reduce that to five filings and made small claims court more like it was intended to be but raised the amount, as you suggest, because the amount, I think, should be raised, how would you respond to that? I would yield my time to Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. I guess I would definitely think about it. I would consider it, definitely. I'm not sure what I would say. I can tell you from...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I mean, your small businessman out...

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, I'm not actually a small businessman any more. I'm not a store owner any more, but when...

SENATOR BEUTLER: No. No, I know.
