member on the State Board of Health; a retired teacher from Lincoln; previously served as a public member of the board...of the Board of Mental Health Practice; a current member of the Nebraska Credentialing Reform Steering Committee. The second is Linda Heiden, a reappointment for a five-year term as public member of the State Board of Health; an insurance agent and farm manager from Bertrand. And she was unable to appear in person, but Senator Schrock appeared in support of her confirmation. Third, Russell Hopp, a new appointment for a four-year term; a physician employed at Creighton University in Omaha. Unable to appear in person, Senator Brown's office offered testimony in support of his confirmation. Fourth, Pamela List: Pamela is a reappointment for a five-year term as a nursing representative on the State Board of Health; a nurse practitioner serving at Franciscan Care Services in West Point; also a member of the Rural Health Advisory Commission. Unable to appear in person, Senator Connealy appeared in support of her confirmation. Fifth, Roger Reamer, a new appointment for a five-year term as a hospital representative on the State Board of Health. He is the chief executive officer of the Memorial Health Care System in Seward. Senator Stuhr appeared in support of his confirmation. Sixth, Robert Sandstrom, a reappointment to a five-year term; a physical therapist and tenured professor of physical therapy at Creighton University in Omaha. Seventh is Dr. Leslie Spry, MD, a reappointment for a five-year term; a physician specializing in kidney conditions from Lincoln; a graduate of Oconto High School, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and University of Nebraska Medical Center. And last is Daryl Wills, a new appointment for a five-year term; a doctor of chiropractic from Gering, Nebraska; previous member of the Board of Chiropractic until 2004, chairman for seven years; immediate past-president of the American Chiropractic Association. Unable to appear in person, Senator Smith appeared in support of his confirmation. I would ask the Legislature also confirm these eight appointments.
