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SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, primarily, credentialing and those things of that nature.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does the board itself conduct any hearings as to whether or not one such professional may or may not be disciplined pursuant to a complaint of some kind?

SENATOR JENSEN: There are various boards that do that. This board does not do that. And are you saying should someone be disciplined for an action that they took or didn't take?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: No, they do not do that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I thought you said something about their considering discipline. In what respect and under what circumstances would they do that?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I don't...I don't think I said discipline.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: I may have, but if I did say discipline that would be incorrect, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then they just meet to sit around and talk about health.

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, they do a lot more than that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Like what?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, certainly health is one of the things that they do look at. Also...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why do they look at it, since they don't do anything?

SENATOR JENSEN: Not look at it. They discuss, review, and then, like I said, we do have areas of scope of practice and
