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SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...which was not directly in Lincoln but you could say that it's within the environs of Lincoln, could you?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I'm sure they've held meetings outside of Lincoln.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you don't...if you've only attended one meeting, what makes you sure they've had meetings outside of Lincoln?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, because they also represent...or they have people from all over the state and, like most boards, they will accommodate those from time to time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We have...

SENATOR JENSEN: And by that, I mean meeting in areas, perhaps Grand Island, perhaps Hastings.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you don't know that for a fact, do you?

SENATOR JENSEN: Not 100 percent fact, no, I do not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you're telling us a lot of notions that you have, beliefs that you have and speculations, but really there's very little you actually know about these people or the board or where it meets. Is that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: I have an acquaintance with several of these individuals personally.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And where did they tell you that meetings are held, if the subject ever came up?

SENATOR JENSEN: That subject did not come up.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So we're back where we started from. You don't really know where they meet, other than that meeting at
