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SENATOR CHAMBERS: When you say Kansas, that is the answer to the question where, which is not the question I posed. The question I posed was what, Wichita what?

SENATOR JENSEN: Wichita East High School.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And that is located in Wichita...

SENATOR JENSEN: Kansas.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Jensen, when you said she is the public member, what does that mean?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, we have all these members who have a specified discipline. She represents the public at large, and so...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what qualifies her to represent the public at large? Is it simply being a nonhealthcare professional? Is that what that refers to?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, certainly she...her background is in more...in education than health, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the intent, if we can divine one, in designating somebody a public member would be to have somebody who is not representative of one of the healthcare professions which will send representatives to this board.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that reasonable to conclude?

SENATOR JENSEN: That is reasonable.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you happen to know how many members that would be called representatives of the public who are on this State Board of Health, if you know?

SENATOR JENSEN: One.
