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SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh) A contest.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me make it general. Is 17 against 2 a fair contest, fair fight, fair anything?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I sometimes wonder if 48 against 1 is a fair fight. (Laughter)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I know it's not fair, and that's why I think you all should have more on your side and that would bring it closer to being fair. Senator Jensen, somebody believed, when they constructed this board...let me not state it. Maybe I'm assuming something. And I told Senator Baker the other day what assuming makes of the person who does it,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...so I won't assume anything. Was it felt that somebody on that board ought to be from the public in order that a point of view could be presented which may not be presented by the representatives of these various healthcare professions?

SENATOR JENSEN: I would think that would be correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it was felt that two people could give that point of view adequately?

SENATOR JENSEN: When this board was established,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...that was certainly probably the consideration.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I know you didn't establish the board...

SENATOR JENSEN: No.
