SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ... representation on the board.

SENATOR JENSEN: I really don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now what are these others? Does that refer to sexual orientation, by chance?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, it...if it is partisan. Is sexual orientation partisan?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, it seems the "Repelicans" certainly think so,...

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...even those whose children fall into the category of being of a different sexual orientation, such as the Vice President. It is a highly partisan designation.

SENATOR JENSEN: You know, it may be. Now for this board, it doesn't make any difference what your party is. There are some boards that are to be composed of so many Republicans, so many Democrats. I don't know what those boards are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought you said that the idea is to ensure representation. I thought you said that and that's why they have the box.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR JENSEN: Represent...representation of a specific discipline.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, why would somebody put a place on that form to designate political affiliation if it has nothing to do with the work of the board or the representation that is to be on the board? Why is it even there?
