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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is the appointee required to put the name?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do we know that? Although the box says check your political affiliation, you're not required to check it. May the appointee pick and choose which boxes or lines he or she checks or fills out? Is the appointee free to do that, if you know?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, if you did that, we certainly would not have any...enough information to then make a judgment whether this person should be advanced.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What on those forms gave you enough information to know that any one of these people is qualified to be appointed to this board?

SENATOR JENSEN: Certainly the education, the employment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you know that they, in fact, have the education that they put on that piece of paper?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I do not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think the position of CEO of RadioShack is an important position?

SENATOR JENSEN: Depending on what...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was that my third time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It was, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Further discussion? Seeing no lights on, Senator Jensen, you're recognized to close on...
