SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was she one of those who appeared herself?

SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then how do you know how she pronounces her last name?

SENATOR JENSEN: Because she...this is a reappointment. I do recall when she presented herself the time before.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how long ago was that?

SENATOR JENSEN: Five years.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Five years ago. Name one other person who was on the board five years ago, no cheating.

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh) I couldn't do that without cheating.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But you remember how this lady pronounced her name.

SENATOR JENSEN: I did. She was from Senator Schrock's district, and some of those I do remember.
