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SENATOR JENSEN: I am sure that they are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Otherwise, we would have all...and, see, I don't know which ones...

SENATOR JENSEN: They don't all expire at the same time, that is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They do, or don't?

SENATOR JENSEN: They do not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Because I didn't know whether some of these are filling unexpired terms, and that would mean that you couldn't tell for sure.

SENATOR JENSEN: Right, and...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why do you think that the terms of the two laypersons would expire at the same time, meaning that there will always be two people on who are serving in that role who come on as "greenies," meaning they both know nothing...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...about what the board is doing? Why would they do that, do you think, if you have an idea?

SENATOR JENSEN: Why are the terms the same?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. They both are bumped off the same time, rather than having the terms overlap so one of the laypersons would have had some experience when the new layperson comes on. Or do you think whoever put the board together didn't think of that?

SENATOR JENSEN: That could have been.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If they thought of it, then they could have had a motive that is not quite pure also. Isn't that possible?
