SENATOR JENSEN: We could.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...about that, couldn't we?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I'm going to ask you to speculate. Why do you think this scoundrel lied about having attended a Baptist institution rather than some other secular school or institution?

SENATOR JENSEN: Perhaps there were board members that he felt that that would have an impression on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He thought...and I'm with you. In my opinion, he thought somebody was going to be impressed by that and they did not check his background at that time. But something caused them to check his background. Now I'm not going to say just because the stock prices were plummeting and they were going to shut down several hundred stores, but that might have said we need to look at how things are being run in the RadioShack operation. That's a possibility, would you think?

SENATOR JENSEN: Possibility.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Or could it be that whereas there was a Baptist majority on the board that hired him, it subsequently became Catholic and they decided that they don't want this Baptist guy; they were going to get a good Catholic?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.
