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know he's not one of your friends? I'm curious.

SENATOR COMBS: I think you're talking about something...I'm talking about mutually exclusive and you are taking it on the other side, saying that if I don't have him on my specific list of friends then I don't know that he may not...could not be a friend. But I do have a specific list in my mind of people that he is not on, to my memory, so he certainly is not on the "A" list of friends.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the only one you'd write a letter for would be one on that list. Is that true, or not true?

SENATOR COMBS: Well, actually, if they had worked with or for me and I knew the quality of their work, based on a purely factual matter, if they weren't my friend but I knew their work quality and I could vouch for that, then certainly I would do that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this person could fit in that category, perhaps.

SENATOR COMBS: Possibly if I had worked with or for them, or they had worked with or for me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator. Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator, is it possible that you had worked with this person at some time?

SENATOR COMBS: Tell me where they worked.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You should have been paying attention.

SENATOR COMBS: Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it possible that this person worked for you at one time?

SENATOR COMBS: No.
