ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 788-789.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone malfunction)...Mr. Clerk, yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, did you...Senator Chambers, we're not under call. We cannot accept your vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, the vote is 34 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of that portion of the report.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Report...that portion of the report, Russell Hopp, has been adopted. Mr. Clerk, next, number four, Pamela List. (Fourth division, Legislative Journal page 756.)

SENATOR JENSEN: (Microphone malfunction)...President, Pamela List is a reappointment for a five-year term as a nursing representative on the State Board of Health. She is a nurse practitioner, serving Franciscan Care Services in West Point; also a member of the Rural Health Advisory Commission; and Senator Connealy appeared in support of her confirmation. She...her education background, she graduated from Madison High School, Madison, South Dakota--not Madison, Nebraska; Methodist Hospital School of Nursing, Memphis, Tennessee, with a degree in nursing; University of the State of New York, in Albany, New York, B.S.N.; and University of Nebraska Medical Center, where she got a master of nursing. She works presently at the Franciscan Care Services. Prior to that she was at the Northwest Community Hospital, Arlington Heights, Illinois; has extensive service in health, rural health. She has done outreach and education, including EMS activities, and she currently serves on the Rural Health Advisory Commission; president of District 6 Nebraska Nurses Association, and recently completed a term as chairperson of the Northeast Health Care Partnership, which was instrumental in working and establishing multicounty health departments in northeast Nebraska.
