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SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator. You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...thank you, Mr. President,...expressing their view that God is visiting various unpleasant things on various individuals and families because there are gay and lesbian people in America. You're familiar with the fact that a fellow does that, and he carries on his activities in conjunction with funerals, usually of military people or gay people. You're aware of that taking place, aren't you?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yeah, and I'm disturbed with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's happening in America, isn't it?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Which would indicate that people who are gay do not hold a position of equal status, when it comes to respect accorded another human being, as those who are not gay. That's an accurate statement, isn't it?

SENATOR JENSEN: It sometimes would seem that it is, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If a person is gay, he can be discriminated against in Nebraska and not...there be no violation of the law involved in that; isn't that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, we have laws on sexual discrimination.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I said gay.

SENATOR JENSEN: Oh. Gay?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We have no protection of people based on sexual orientation. Senator Foley and others, Senator Smith and probably you, too, have voted against providing legal protection. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: I may have, yes.
