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SENATOR JENSEN: Yeah, okay. Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is killing these people because of gay and lesbian culture in America, and that's God's way of showing that He's mad...God is angry! He is angry, Senator Jensen. Is this man entitled to believe in God according to the dictates of his conscience?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, we all have the right to believe, I guess, in who we want to believe in.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, that's not a matter of guesswork. Under the law that is an absolute right that a person has.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator, but you may continue.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm doing a little conscience raising and consciousness raising this morning. Senator...my time is running, Mr. President. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, (laugh) Senator Jensen, I have nothing against any of these appointees, and they'll all be approved this morning. The mainstream is going to speak. Are you aware of anybody on this list who has a sexual orientation different from that of the mainstream, meaning what they call heterosexual, which means they have many sex partners of the opposite sex? It's better and more acceptable in this society to have many sex partners of the opposite sex than to have one sex partner of the same sex. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: I have no knowledge of what any of these individuals that are presented here this morning...
