SENATOR BROWN: You don't think that financial...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...the financial piece has anything to do with a person who may not have been born in Nebraska, who may not have any connection with Nebraska, other than having lived here for a short period of time before their retirement, you don't think that that has any bearing on their decision about where they retire?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not the amount you're talking about here, because one of the people that Senator Redfield quoted had talked about the lesser cost of a house in Alabama. Well, maybe everything in Alabama is cheaper, but it certainly cannot be traced to this \$800 boon that they would receive under this bill, perhaps.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, these people who ordinarily sound rational, even when I think they're not, are now stretching to such an extent that it calls into credibility their understanding of anything relative to economic development, and they're willing to make statements which are patently false on their face. When students who have gone to the University of Nebraska say that they're not going to stay here, they don't say this because they got to pay taxes. There are no opportunities of the kind that they want. An article had been written in the World-Herald to show the varied reasons people have for leaving here. One person talked about the absence of art events, music, museums, concerts, and things that maybe other people would not give any thought to in making a determination about where they will live. Others talk about coming to Nebraska because they can go to these little towns and find what they call a small-town environment. When you go across the spectrum and look at the reasons people give for relocating from one place to another, and they're taking their
