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increases the length, 81 feet, 6 inches. It's been a problem throughout the years, and I commend him, his constituent, and staff for working through the federal congressional delegation and getting the waiver for Nebraska. Kansas and South Dakota already had it, and quite honestly, it was causing hardship for custom cutters in the wheat harvest, mostly, coming through the state and being subjected to either a ticket or unhooking a trailer, and then coming back and pulling that trailer from Kansas through the state, to South Dakota, or it could have stopped in Nebraska. So we support...I support the amendment, it's AM2296, and would urge its adoption. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Further discussion? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I discussed this amendment briefly with Senator Stuthman, even more briefly with Senator Cunningham, and had requested that he explain it thoroughly on the floor, which he has done. Any questions that I had have been answered. I didn't have doubts, but just...I was unsure. And I'm going to support his amendment, and I want to make that announcement, because Senator Cunningham seems to think I oppose everything he brings, even though I supported one of his bills in the Judiciary Committee. But I'm announcing this time that I'm definitely supporting this one. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Cunningham. And there are no further lights on, Senator Cunningham. I recognize you to close, if you care to, either speak or close.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: I will just speak briefly and close at the same time. Senator Chambers, I appreciate that. I would ask you to turn around and please bow to my parents, who happen to be here. You know, they've witnessed this historic moment, so thank you. (Laughter) And with that, I will end the closing, also.
