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SENATOR JENSEN: ...several of them, but they must participate in some.

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Jensen, here's what I'm trying to get at, so let me use an analogy. If I enter a contract with Senator Bourne and he is going to repair my vehicle, in order for him to receive money from me, he has to uphold his end of the contract. If he doesn't repair it, I don't have to pay him.

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now what I want to find out, is this contract that you've mentioned a document that contains mandated requirements? Or is everything in it based on a person being requested to do these things but not being required to do any of them?

SENATOR JENSEN: In order to fulfill the contract, they must participate within that program.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does the contract state that you have a listing of 7, 8, 10, or 12 items from which you may choose any number, but you must comply with a certain minimum number of these requirements? Is that the way the contract is written?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this work experience is one of the items?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, and by this amendment, we're taking that out of that...placement shall not exceed three months. We're removing that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, which means you can keep this person in slavery in one of these programs, where they're not paid anything, indefinitely. So if this is one of the requirements, right now that person is shielded from some vindictive
