as property and worked like beasts of burden, and treated with a cruelty that would have been a crime if inflicted on four-footed beasts. So that's why I call George Bush Simon Legree. He is the one who is saying, as I understand it—and you can correct me—that if you want to count these individuals who have not been able to find a job, in order to try to reach that 50 percent threshold, they have to be placed in a status where if they are doing unpaid work for a profit—making enterprise or organization, there can be no limit in the statute on how long they can be held to perform that unpaid labor. Is that the way you understand it? And if not, I would like you to tell me where your understanding is different from mine.

SENATOR JENSEN: My understanding is that they must find work, whether that be working for pay or as I would like to just, if you would permit me--and I'll turn my light on to give you more time--as it states here, unsubsidized employment; subsidized employment; private-sector subsidized private-sector (sic) experience, if sufficient private-sector employment; work employment is not available; on-the-job training; job search and job readiness assistance; community service programs; vocational education training; job skills training directly related to employment; education directly related to employment, in the case of the recipient who has not received a high school diploma or a certificate of high school equivalency; satisfactory attendance at secondary school or in a course of study leading to a certificate of general equivalency, GED; if the recipient not completed secondary school or received such a certificate, providing childcare services to an individual who is participating in a community service program. Now that's I would think anybody could find...I...not quite a list. I would think that most people could find employment with those, that listing of those...of the 11 positions that they have.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, you mention things which, if a person did, will not generate any income for that person. Did you see such things in that listing that you just read? Let me ask the question a different way. Will each one of those items listed by you result in the person being compensated with cash?
