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SPEAKER BRASHEAR: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ... requires this language to be stricken.

May I ask Senator Jensen a question now ...

SENATOR ERDMAN: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and leave from you,...

SENATOR ERDMAN: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because he's Chairman? Senator Jensen, who arranged to give your committee a briefing, and who provided

that briefing?

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Senator Jensen, will you yield?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes. Mike...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What's his position? That will be good

enough.

SENATOR JENSEN: Mike Harrelson (phonetic) and he is on the

Welfare-to-Work program over at HHS.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does that mean he directs that program, or

what does he do?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, he's administrator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And is he the one who drafted this language, or is he the one who told you, with reference to this specific language I'm talking about, that the federal government requires

that language to be stricken?

SENATOR JENSEN: He was the one who gave us the briefing.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Members, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do now sign the following
