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standards, access standards, as far as a public road meeting a...I'm sorry, a private road meeting a public road, would probably be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: the first...probably the first instance where they would be subject to a public standard.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What does this board actually do? But before you answer that, I do have a preliminary question. Do they have regularly scheduled meetings? By that I mean, are there so many meetings they are required to hold per year, at a minimum?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I believe so. I'll have to check to confirm that, but I believe they said they met quarterly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And where do they meet?

SENATOR BAKER: I believe most of the meetings are in Lincoln, although I...things are running together. I think some of them rotate these meetings around the state, and I don't...I can't honestly...I don't know whether this board does or not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many people are there on this board altogether?

SENATOR BAKER: I'll have to get that for you, but I think there's nine or ten. I'll...that I'll have to get. I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What is the length of a person's appointment? How many years is a person appointed for?

SENATOR BAKER: Four years, I believe.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And are these terms staggered?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And Mr. Acklie, if I heard you correctly, is
