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SENATOR BAKER: There is an appeal process, yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And what we expect is that these people when they're appointed, if they don't know what the board is about, they will apprise themselves of what the board's duties and responsibilities and powers are. Correct?

SENATOR BAKER: Correct, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there any literature given to new appointees which they can consult and be apprised of what their duties are going to be?

SENATOR BAKER: I'm sure there is. I'm sure there is, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you ever attended a meeting of this board?

SENATOR BAKER: No, I have not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What did Mr. Yonkey say that particularly impressed you, if anything?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, I looked at his resume and the service he's provided over the years and that's a big part of what I made my decision on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you said he did appear and seemed to enjoy himself while he was before the committee, correct?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. I think they all did.
