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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Give me an idea, an example of what is considered fun on the Transportation Committee.

SENATOR BAKER: Well, we've had a...ever since I've been on the committee, we've always had interesting and lively discussions about license plates and how innovative people can be when they request personalized plates and so on. And that's, to me, that's always been fun and an interesting topic, and I think the committee shares that view.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You brought up a license plate bill that Senator Foley has, correct?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did it come before your committee?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, it did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And your committee advanced it to the floor.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I believe last session.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you vote for it?

SENATOR BAKER: I think...I'm not sure that I did. I'm going to have to check the record, Senator Chambers. I believe I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you support license plates becoming virtual billboards?

SENATOR BAKER: Not entirely, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What do you think the actual purpose and function of a license plate would be?

SENATOR BAKER: Identify a vehicle and that the registration fees have been paid on that vehicle.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it's evidence of the fact that this vehicle legally is on the road.
