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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sometimes when Senator Chambers is approached to try to elicit a certain kind of conduct from him, does he sometimes say, well, I want to get a certain kind of conduct from you, whoever that person is talking to him?

SENATOR BAKER: That has happened, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you willing to deal this morning with Senator Chambers?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, depends on the deal, but I'm willing to talk to you, yes, Senator Chambers. I'm ready to deal at this point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you willing to remove your amendment from that bill we were discussing yesterday?

SENATOR BAKER: We'll have to talk about that a bit, but I could be amiable to discussing that and probably work something out with you, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's as much as I could ask for from you this morning, Senator Baker, and I hope your colleagues realize that they owe you a debt of gratitude because I am through with your confirmation reports other than I will cast a vote in favor of what you've sent out here to us today. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the second confirmation report offered by the Transportation Committee? There are no lights on. Senator Baker, you're recognized to close on the second report. Senator Baker, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I won't take long, but I do need to remind the body, I guess, what we're voting on now. This is the Nebraska Railway Council. The appointees are Robert Kelly, Michael Shannon, and Jamie Karl, and I'd ask for approval of their confirmation at this time. Thank you.
