SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could you tell me what you object to in the amendment?

SENATOR BURLING: Be a low percentage, and you have to talk as a...

SENATOR BURLING: Well, if they...are they raiding the till legally or illegally? Embezzling or...obeying the law or not obeying the law?
