SENATOR BURLING: Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, this is a good amendment. If you listened to my and Senator Burling's discussion....

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you would see that what we're dealing with is an entrepreneur or some entrepreneurs, plural. As Senator Burling pointed out, there will be one person to represent industry and manufacturers. At that point, I must ask Senator Burling a question which does not go directly to my offered amendment but to what's in his amendment. Senator Burling, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling.

SENATOR BURLING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Burling, do you think the interests of industry and manufacturing are the same?

SENATOR BURLING: Basically, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think there are differences?

SENATOR BURLING: There are some differences. You have wholesale and retail involved here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would manufacturing be considered an industry?

SENATOR BURLING: I think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But not all industries include manufacturing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you agree with that?
