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fiscal officer is who would sign checks, vouchers, and so forth.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. So, in other words, that if the individual and the illustration that we're using about \$25 to get a job done, or \$35 the individual would try to get from this public till, but I don't think it would be the fault of the individual that is trying to get the \$35 if this public till money...and there's some individuals that are responsible for this public till money, you know, has got to be accountable and is willing to pay the \$35. The raider of that is not doing wrong or he's not doing anything illegal. If there's something wrong with it, then I think it has to come back to the responsibility of the entity that's in control of the public till money. Would you believe this to be correct, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and that's why I pointed out that the raider is not somebody who committed a crime by what he or she did, but simply gouged from that governmental body more than was justified for what was being sold to that governmental body. So the term "raider" is not the same as "criminal."

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes. But the word...the gouging part of it kind of disturbs me a little bit. The individual, you know, trying to get more money, someone is allowing them to gouge it or to raid it, and then I really think that the responsibility or the problem comes from that entity. And I'm not faulting the person that is gouging. I'm faulting the ones that are allowing that gouging to take place. That's where I think the problem comes. Would you agree with that, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Absolutely. That's why I have my amendment. So the mere fact that somebody has been a sharp entrepreneur and obtained a higher price than maybe the government ought to have paid, such a person should not be prevented from being a representative on this board. You and I are saying the same thing. (Laugh)

SENATOR STUTHMAN: And this is what I'm trying to lead into because, you know, in your amendment a raider, raider of the public till, those words...
