

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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FLOOR DEBATE

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SENATOR STUTHMAN: I don't think there's raiders of the public till. I think there are public till officials allowing things to happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How about plunderers? Are there those who plunder the public till?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: I don't...I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But there could be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how...what would your number have to be in order for you to support the amendment? What number would it have to reach?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Senator Chambers, if you changed it to plunderer?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, forget the word. What number would have to be accorded my amendment in order for you to support the amendment?
