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LB 542

SENATOR FLOOD: To use caution, but proceed carefully.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But they are not required to stop. Is that true?

SENATOR FLOOD: That is true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There should be someplace where a person can see precisely what these flashing lights mean, because it's not the flashing but the color of the light that dictates how a motorist is to respond. Would you agree?

SENATOR FLOOD: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, I don't know how much you've looked at this bill, but since it's talking about this tax study commission, or whatever the exact terminology is, it will be dealing with technical detailed information. Do you agree?

SENATOR FLOOD: I would imagine that to be the case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And we are trying, with the language that is being discussed here and elsewhere in the bill, to give some direction to that commission so that they will be aware of what the Legislature is looking for them to achieve through their work. In general, would you agree with that?

SENATOR FLOOD: I would agree with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And should we give directions, not necessarily like boilerplate or laundry list, but which is clear enough so that it won't have multiple interpretations?

SENATOR FLOOD: I would think that in this situation we could have potentially identified the states that we wanted the commission to review.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
