In fact, if we were honest, we would acknowledge that we don't really expect them to do anything that is going to make this Legislature any difference. My mind is boggled by Senator Burling's suggestion that because eight senators are to be members of this commission, somehow the work is going to be better, and a product that is better than what has been presented in the past will be made available to us. I'd like to know who those eight senators are, but we don't know because they haven't been appointed yet.
