So this is not a backdoor attempt or a front door attempt or any attempt whatsoever to get into the medical research questions that you and I have a disagreement on, and we know that. It's been a very polite and pleasant disagreement, but we don't see eye to eye on that question. That's a debate for another day. That debate really is not part of this bill, because we're only talking about unborn life in utero, and we've made that very clear. You also asked a good question about the dispensing of drugs by a pharmacist or...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR FOLEY: Time is up.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Foley and Senator Johnson. And for the record, I should say it was Senator Engel's time, not Senator Schimek's time, that went to Senator Foley prior to this. On with discussion of the Chambers amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Foley has a way of referring to words that I uttered in a context that it could...that could make it appear I said something other than what I did. I have never suggested that there are not certain drugs that can be passed from the mother to the fetus. But I have never said that's a basis for punishing a woman. I have never said that, never implied it, and would not imply it. I did not say that under Senator Foley's bill a woman could be prosecuted for drinking alcohol while pregnant. I said there are examples where rogue prosecutors have actually done that. There is no law in Nebraska that allows them to do that, but these politicians will do anything. There are women who have been put in jail, in what has been called protective custody, so that she couldn't harm the fetus. She hadn't committed a crime, but she was using drugs. And I'll try to find some of these articles. But you all who know how to use these computers, you can find those kind of cases. These vicious, vindictive prosecutors have done what I have said they have done, so Senator Foley must have misunderstood what I said. I said it because he was mentioning how prosecutors are going to exercise sound discretion. And my
