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examples were to show that, in the real world, they do not. The Douglas County Attorney hired snitches to try to frame a black man for first-degree murder, and the jury saw through it and they acquitted the man. And the prosecutor knew he didn't have a case. Another instance--and it just happens these are black men--a man the prosecutor knew was innocent was kept in jail for a period of time, days. And they knew at the time that he was innocent and should not have been there, so he's currently suing the county. I know what these prosecutors will do. Senator Foley did not stand on the floor and say he thinks I'm lying about these tens of thousands of children starving--I mentioned Africa, but there are other countries, too--or that there are tens of thousands dying from treatable diseases, and that there is not the outcry in this country to do something about alleviating the problems of those children, as there have been outcries against giving aid to countries where there might be birth control taught, tolerated, approved, or whatever. That's the reality. Senator Foley mentioned, while talking about drugs, that a pregnant woman could be drugged without knowing it. Well, let's say she was administered a drug without knowing it and it resulted directly in harm to the fetus. Who is she going to finger, since she doesn't know when she was drugged or who drugged her? So why would he bring up an example like that, which his bill is not going to help at all? It's to make a point. It's to make a point that does not have to be made here because everybody concedes it. Not only pregnant women, but women who are not pregnant have drinks spiked. We know that. The point here is that Senator Foley is offering a preposterous bill which is impossible of enforcement during the early stages of a pregnancy. And for those people wallowing in ignorance who send me those pictures of fetuses, they ought to send them to Senator Foley to show him what they envision being contemplated under this bill. What I would have to send them is a piece of white paper with nothing on it and say, this is what Senator Foley is talking about. And they'd write me back and say, fool, you're just as ignorant as I thought, and that's why we need term limits;...
