SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...because these crack babies and babies that are damaged from the very beginning are some of the priciest persons that we have to take care of. You know, in terms of cost to society, if you really want to strike a blow, here's your opportunity. Not only would you be striking a blow for the right thing, but you would be applying equality before the law. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Howard.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, treating two people the same way does not always equate to equality. Senator Beutler knows that. Senator Foley created a quandary. He's agin this amendment; Senator Beutler is for it. I usually go Senator Beutler's way. This time Senator Foley is the one in agreement with my position. So Senator Beutler's amendment is not going to be adopted because the Catholic position is going to win out. A fetus is not a person. A fetus is not, quote, another. How you...I'd like to ask Senator...I'd like to ask...oh, I don't see Dr. Johnson. I'd like to ask Senator Howard a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Howard, would you yield?

SENATOR HOWARD: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Howard, what's the youngest you have read or heard of a female becoming pregnant?

SENATOR HOWARD: The youngest in terms of adolescent mothers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Yes.
