this symbolism is about. There are more things going on around you every day, and you have no idea of what is entailed. Why is it that in all the years they've been doing this stuff with Ak-Sar-Ben, no older woman has ever done anything worthy of note? You all think I'm lying when I talk about how women are oppressed in this society. Everything they do, they show you, they demonstrate it, and you don't pick up on it. Why don't they have a young man for the king if they're going to have a young woman for the queen? Because that's not the symbolism they want to project. Women are trophies. Women are commodities. Women are sexualized objects. The movies, the videos depict male sexual fantasies. That's what they're about. Watch them and see. Look what the men are interested in. Maybe you didn't know it, but now you'll pay attention. And when we have legislatures...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...peopled primarily by men, who bring law after law to oppress women and make it more difficult for them when they're at their most vulnerable, it shows the generalized hatred of women that permeates this society. You can't begin to find the number of degrading terms applied to men that are applied to women. And you know when the woman has that term applied to her? When she has allowed herself to be dominated and misused by a man. These bad names they hang on her are in conjunction with the way men mistreat these women. And those of you all who are in school, you know it. You may not want to accept it. But what my amendment does is strikes that language about mother of an unborn child, and substitutes "the pregnant woman" in their place. Thank you, Mr. President.
