SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I don't know, Senator. I'd prefer not to. I'd prefer to work through some amendments and have them voted down and just advance the bill on a voice vote. That would be my preference. Would that be possible, Senator? (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Consider the amendments and have them voted down? Why, instead...

SENATOR FOLEY: Vote down the amendments pending, and then move the bill forward on a voice vote. Would that be possible, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I don't think it would be possible to move it on a voice vote.

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator, may I ask you a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it again?

SENATOR FOLEY: May I ask you a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Certainly.

SENATOR FOLEY: Are you aware that there's a possibility that I may not be in the Legislature next year?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I know you're not going to be here next year.

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I don't know that for a fact. It's possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, but you...see, even if we prevail and the Supreme Court does the right thing and overturns term limits, the fact that you're unopposed for your...

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, I have an opposing...there is an opposing candidate in my race.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A "Repelican," or on the other side?

SENATOR FOLEY: One of the other sides.
