SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...here and letting the bill die out there on the ballot or keeping what he's got and maybe letting the bill die here. There's a middle ground. Take my amendment and let your bill move, Senator Beutler. You don't know what you might be able to achieve in terms of changing my mind. Somebody, by the time your bill comes up, might have made me a delicious bread pudding, rice pudding, peach cobbler, who knows, put me in a very mellow mood. Senator Beutler, keep your bill alive. That would be my advice. I'd like to ask Senator Beutler a question. How much time do I have?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You have about 18 seconds, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, well, I can't...well, the question I would ask is that Senator Beutler show by his vote whether or not he's going to accept this proposition, by voting for my amendment and getting his bill moved. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing on FA422, amendment to LB 75. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye; opposed, nay. We're voting on adoption of the Chambers amendment, which is FA422. Have you...Senator Chambers, what purpose...?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. The house is under call.
