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SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, I think so. I mean, you're saying the bill will go on to Final Reading, and I can talk to the people who are involved in the bill, and if they're satisfied with it that way, it will proceed that way; if not, I can make an effort on Final Reading to bring it back and strike your amendment. Is that what you're saying?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you can talk to me to see if you can get me to modify my position also. I'm not saying I won't talk to you. I had said that I regret that yours is the first bill that came up. So this is one of those different situations. Senator Beutler, what you're in a position to do is give us both the opportunity to put off making a final decision. You will give me something by adopting my amendment; I will give you something by letting the bill move forward and agreeing to listen to whatever argument you can present. And I wouldn't say that if there was no possibility of me altering my position. I wouldn't toy with you like that, because we've not dealt with each other in that manner.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, we've always dealt with each other in a very straightforward manner, and I appreciate that, and I think I'll take you up on your suggestion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, Mr. President, I'm not going to take a long time to talk. This is a motion to reconsider. When we get the votes to reconsider...and, for the record, how many votes does it take to reconsider, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Twenty-five, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I just want everybody to be aware of what it is that we're doing, and it's in the record. I hope we can get the 25 votes to reconsider. I hope we can get the votes to adopt my amendment. Then that puts Senator Beutler and me in a position to work further on his bill. But that work will not be done on Select File. His bill would then move forward, and then we have time to work, without his bill being delayed or held up at this stage. So that's what I'm envisioning, and Senator Beutler said he would take me up on it. So I'm asking that we get those votes, and he can move his bill, and then we'll see
