obviously the cities and counties are in favor of this, but Senator Raikes' argument is we don't want to spend the money through the state aid formula to make them whole. But quite honestly I think it's something we need to do. It puts some more funds available to cities and counties. I think everyone that's been involved with road discussions in the last few years says we don't have enough money going into the fund. This provides some money to that fund. It also cleans up the process dramatically. In fact, it eliminates one whole process of distributing this back to the counties, and then the treasurers in each county distributing it from there. So yes, I can't deny it. There's a transfer of restricted funds from the apportioned motor vehicles to the schools that's going to go away, and we're going to make it up with state aid; hence, the A bill that will trail along with this. The only folks that won't be made whole out of this, I think there's...I was talking to a superintendent of a nonequalized district just a bit ago, and I believe he told me...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...there were 14 districts in the state that are nonequalized this year. He said 14. I'm just taking this superintendent's word for it. He happened to be a superintendent of one of them that's not equalized. And I don't have a new printout as to how many dollars that might affect a few of those unequalized districts, but it's not much. And he said, for the good of the cause, he thought, no more than it was, they probably could go along with it. So that, I think, summarizes what Senator Raikes said. It is a judgment call here. We're trying to clean up a process, transferring some funds that had been going...probably 60 percent of these funds, this \$7 million, probably 60 percent of it overall, went to schools. When we take that away from them, the state aid formula is going to make it up, but the money that...the entire amount of money is going to go to the cities and counties to be used for roads. I would be glad to answer any questions. I understand Senator Raikes' concern, but I do believe that those...all the districts other than unequalized districts will be made whole. Thank you.
