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where he thinks he can get a little play, here he comes,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...jumping in, and then watch the way he does it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers and Senator Howard. Further discussion? Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. One thing, if you want to get Senator Chambers stirred up, is you want to point out that...some of the shortcomings that he's doing in his own district. Out where I live, we're probably what, 70 miles from the sheriff, 30 or 40 miles from any state patrolman, that sort of thing. So there are guns carried out there. Not everybody has one, but nonetheless, we have very few armed robberies. I can't remember one in any of the towns up and down Highway 20 for probably 30 years or more. Sure, there's a...whoever this kook was in Calloway, and that's getting down in your farming country, down there around Broken Bow, that's probably another deal where there was some partying. They was drinking or whatever was going on, and that kind of deal is a deadly situation, and that isn't what this law is all about. This is about arming the private citizens, if they so desire to be. Just because this law is put in effect doesn't mean that the people in Senator Chambers' district or anyone else has to go and get a gun permit. They don't have to buy one. It isn't mandatory you go buy a gun or get a permit when this goes through. You can live the same life you always have lived, but what you need to point out is there are things that are happening to people in some of these districts. Senator Chambers there, if he would...concerned about that, instead of expounding on what's going on in other parts of the state and complaining, I would like to see him probably perhaps put some kind of amendment on here that there would be some state monies funded for the safety of the citizens in his district. I'd certainly vote for an amendment like that. That's the route we should go, is to...is the safety of the citizens in our district there. This is a...this is what the state legislature is all about. That's what they should be, is the safety of the
