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SENATOR COMBS: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What do they have to do once they get the permit? A person has the permit, and it's good for five years. The five years expire. In order to get the permit renewed, what does a person have to do, under your bill?

SENATOR COMBS: Under my bill, they're just...they're going to have to go back and pay another fee, and be rechecked again.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Where is that in your bill, because I see you looking at something.

SENATOR COMBS: Well, you'll have to give me a moment off the mike,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure.

SENATOR COMBS: ...if permission is given to stand at ease, and I can look at my amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, no, I will continue talking, and it will give you the opportunity, because I have a few things that I can say which will give us some additional time. Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Cornett a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Cornett, would you respond?

SENATOR CORNETT: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Cornett, you voted for this bill, correct?

SENATOR CORNETT: Yes, I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you read the bill, correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CORNETT: Yes.
