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SENATOR COMBS: Pay your fee.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm waiting.

SENATOR COMBS: That's all I could find. I just wanted to make sure that I was correct before I answered you on the record.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And before you had a chance to look it up...and the reason I asked the question, because I knew what the answer was. You shouldn't ask a question when you don't know the answer.

SENATOR COMBS: That's good.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, you had said during our discussion, prior to my asking you the question, that the person would have to do these various things, the shooting and practicing and so forth, and that is not in the bill. There is no requirement in the bill for that to be done. Do you agree with that?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Now, you said that you think that a person should not have to show any competency with a weapon once they get the permit. Or is it your opinion that they should have to show competency after getting that initial permit?

SENATOR COMBS: They will have already shown competency before they have been issued the permit.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you don't think they should have to demonstrate that again? That's the question I'm asking you.

SENATOR COMBS: I don't see where that would be necessary if they have done what they were trained to do, and that is, you continue to dry practice, you just stay ready. These...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, but you're...those are things you're saying. There is nothing in the bill that requires a person to
