SENATOR COMBS: Not on that particular issue. You are correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you had read your bill, I know, at some point, hadn't you?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes, I have read my bill several times.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yet you criticized that editorial writer for not having read it. And here's what I'm getting at. Not only you, Senator Combs, but a lot of these people on the floor who voted for your bill, have no idea what's in it. So in order to improve their education and remove their ignorance, since you were telling them what might have to be done, based on Section 7 of your bill,...

SENATOR COMBS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...would you read Section 7?

SENATOR COMBS: Section 7. Hold on. And this is of AM0810. It's not of the bill, so some of the...because we had a confusion there on General Fund, and we had an amendment for Public Safety Cash Fund, too, so this is from the amendment. An applicant shall be at least 21 years of age; not be prohibited from purchasing or possessing handguns by 18 U.S.C. 922, as such section existed on January 1, 2005; possess the same powers of eyesight as required under Section 60-4,118 for the Class O operator's license. If an applicant does not possess a current Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license, the applicant may present a current optometrist's or ophthalmologist's statement certifying the vision reading obtained when testing the applicant. If such certified vision reading meets the vision requirement prescribed by Section 60-4,118 for a Class O operator's license, the vision requirements of this subdivision shall have been met.
