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least at this time, there is no national registry on mental health; that they will need to go to other states, which may have totally different statutes governing it, to get that information. That's going to take a staff person time, because they have to assure that to reissue that permit. We have lots of requirements in here. I don't think \$50 is anywhere close to covering it when we know already just the criminal history check portion that we charge--which is the actual cost from the federal government and \$10, which is what the fee is that the State Patrol charges for their actual costs--is \$33. There are too many other requirements here. We should be good fiscal stewards for the state. We should amend the original bill to make sure that the costs are sufficient to cover what it's going to take to administer this, and it shouldn't be a way to generate funds. We're not a retail operation. This is a way, I believe, that a small group of people who want to carry their guns around now, they shouldn't have to pay for other things in state government. If it's too much, it should be too much. We should...it should be set on a study, which would be what would come out from rules and regs, if we adopted an amendment that said that this covers the actual costs. I think we should reconsider what we've done here. Take the time, everybody, to read the amendment, see what exactly is in this...in this bill. I know it was jammed to get out of committee. I know there was a lot of pressure brought on to push it out of committee. It is a flawed bill. But on top of all of that and all the other philosophical reasons we have for being concerned about where guns are carried secretly in our communities, we also have a responsibility to that state agency to make sure it's not going to divert...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...their good work on behalf of the safety of citizens of the state to be able to take care of the hobby of a small number of people who think it's important to carry guns around hidden. Thank you.
