same way. But sometimes I do contrary, at a later date, to what I say I want to do on a prior date. Other people have said repeatedly that what I do anybody can do, and I have rejoined repeatedly, but they're not going to do it. They don't have the belly for it, the backbone for it, the knowledge for it. They don't have the stamina. They don't have the determination. A glare or a scowl from one of their colleagues or some of their colleagues will make them wilt.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Try it on me and all you do is stimulate me to reach higher heights and deeper depths. And I've only got about 20 days to do it. And some of you all will never see me again and I'll never see you again, so what do I care whether or not you get something through that you say you want? The saving grace behind this atrocity that these people whose names I read perpetrated is that Omaha can ban the carrying of these concealed weapons, and if some of these nuts come from outstate Nebraska into Omaha, I hope they get caught, and I hope they're prosecuted. And from what I read in the letter that was signed by the mayor and police chief of Lincoln, that city is not soon going to authorize the carrying of concealed weapons.
