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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now...and we got 19 days of this, but you won't be the only one. Will you be pleased to see some of your colleagues go through what you are going through now during the upcoming...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...19 days?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: And there are no further lights on at this moment. Senator Chambers, will recognize you to close on (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: For my encore. Thank you, Mr. President. Picking up where we left off, Senator Friend, will you be pleased to see some of your colleagues dealt with in the way that I'm dealing with you?

SENATOR FRIEND: Yes, I think I would be pleased. Yeah. I mean I think it's...to me, this is part of the deliberative process, especially if it actually starts to become formative.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If it starts to pick up what?

SENATOR FRIEND: Especially if it starts to become valuable and formative.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you don't think is informative?

SENATOR FRIEND: Well, formative or informative. I think that there are parts that have been, yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR FRIEND: But parts that may be less.
