Now, who can make this charge? Whenever any three councilmen shall make and file with the clerk of said court the proper charges against the mayor, alleging and showing that he is guilty of...I guess this wouldn't work against the current mayor, since she's not of the appropriate gender. But in any event, if he is guilty of malfeasance or misfeasance, or incompetence or neglect, or other good and sufficient cause. And then it goes on to say the mayor or any three councilmen can do the same thing, file charges against any other councilperson. So we already have on the books for our city, apparently, a statute that I've never ever seen used, but certainly contains the seeds for some mischief. I guess the reason that I point it out to you is several. Just to indicate a difference, in some cases, as to who can bring the charge. In this case, it's councilpersons or the mayor; in the case of...that we're dealing with this this morning, it's any person, any citizen. And then the subject matter that we're dealing with. When you say, other good and sufficient cause, that's extremely broad, and I'm not sure how the courts would interpret that. But in any event, as you work further on this bill towards Select File, I would like to discuss with you a little bit whether 15-332 is needed at all if we're going to change the nature of the...
