And so I think that there are some things...having gone through now all, I think, all of the Chambers amendments, and thinking that some of them are...probably have more merit than others, but they're all okay, at least from my first reading of them, wouldn't it make more sense for us to try to do this as an amendment, one full amendment to fix the technical pieces, before we come back on Select File? I would just suggest that as a way to deal with it, because I think that it might be more...we might be able to get a better work product than trying to do it the way we've been doing it this morning.
